- 3. MaineDOT Updates (Including personnel changes).
 - CADD Bob Skehan
 - Department is undergoing the Windows 7 upgrade.
 - CADD Subcommittee is reviewing the MaineDOT CADD Manual and CADD Standards.
 - CADD Subcommittee has held one meeting. Peggy will follow up with the subcommittee cochair.
 - The CADD Standards on the MaineDOT website are in progress.
 - STIC Funds for 3-D Modeling MaineDOT has not started the work proposed under the EDC grant due to the work involved with the Windows 7 upgrade. The EDC project will look at the process for construction management and develop training and a manual.
 - Contract Procurement Office Debbi Farrell
 - Department-wide RFQ In the last week of the shortlisting phase. Letters should go out between mid-February and March 1st. MaineDOT will post the revised prequalified list of consultants and re-open the "Open Prequalification".
 - Project Development will interview all construction management/inspection services areas through one interview. Multimodal Program will do the same.
 - Audited overhead rates and field rates are required to get a Construction Services GCA.

 - Construction GCA Contracts this time around will be for 3.5 years. Next RFQ will be in 2017.

- There will be needs in all of the regions. MaineDOT will send out a list to all Construction Services GCA firms requesting staffing availability for the Regions and Programs.

- Bridge Design Last met on 1/16/2015
 - Discussion included the work plan and ideas for training programs.
 - Ben Foster has been joining the meetings to with respect to Load Ratings. Ben expects that consultants are using engineering judgment and creativity on their assignments.
 - Next meeting on 3/17/15 will focus on Next Beam cracking issues.
- Highway Design Last meeting was in mid December 2014.
 - Partnered with MaineDOT on Engineering Instructions and the revisions date next to the documents are helpful.
 - MaineDOT is working on Sample Plans.
 - Be Schonewald presented on the new specification and standard details for signal and sign foundations.
- LPA Focusing on Small Harbor Improvements
 - The team wants to focus on education the person within the Municipality who plans the project is not necessarily the person who delivers it.
- Multimodal Last meeting was in October, 2014.
 - Marine Facilities Design Guide will be discussed at the next meeting at meeting

- 9. 2014 Calendar Year Delivery Performance Summary Rich Crawford
 - 2014 was the fourth year in a row that MaineDOT exceeded their delivery goal
 - Bridge 87%
 - Highway 92%
 - Multimodal 81%
 - LAP Projects 32%

MaineDOT is concerned with the low percentage of LPA projects delivered on time. They are considering the following:

- Loss of Funding for projects not moving forward
- Disallow some Municipalities from administering projects
- Municipalities are required to submit monthly project progress reports
- MaineDOT asks Consultants to help the Municipalities they are working with move the projects forward.

- 11. Maine Turnpike Authority Kristi Van Ooyen
 - MTA issued their Highway and Bridge RFP on Friday, January 23, 2015
 - 12 consultants were invited to submit. All firms must hold a current MaineDOT Bridge Design GCA and be prequalified for Highway Design.
 - MTA anticipates that two firms will receive five year contracts.
 - No determination on the value other than approximately \$2 3 Million
