## **Highlights from ACEC Annual Convention**

1,000-plus business and policy leaders attended ACEC's Annual Convention in Washington, D.C. – including delegations from China, India, Canada, Australia, Korea and Nigeria; 70 first-time attendees; and representatives of colleague associations including ASCE, ARTBA, FIDIC and NCEES. Highlights included Greg Ip (Economist magazine) who said we are now in a slow,

sustained recovery; a debate between Patrick Buchanan (MSNBC) and Eleanor Clift (Newsweek); the signing of a partnership agreement with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers; CEO insights from George Pierson of Parsons Brinckerhoff, Len Rodman of Black & Veatch and Bob Uhler of MWH; and a CIO workshop led by chief technology officers from AECOM, Jacobs, Malcolm Pirnie and WSP Flack & Kurtz.

In addition, ACEC's **Grand Conceptor Award** for top engineering achievement of the year was won by HDR for a power facility fueled by onion skins. Grand Awards went to Walter P. Moore, Hatch Mott MacDonald, Jacobs, Magnusson Klemencic, HNTB, Brown and Caldwell, and Michael Baker, Jr.

During the ACEC Annual Convention in D.C. in late April, Chris D. Poland, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, Degenkolb Engineers, was recognized for his many years of outstanding service and dedication to CASE.
