## Middle East/North Africa Embassy Officials to Discuss Infrastructure Opportunities with U.S. Engineering Leaders

WASHINGTON, DC (April 18, 2013)—Officials from five Middle East/North Africa (MENA) embassies will meet with leading U.S. engineering firms to explore overseas opportunities in infrastructure.

The program is jointly sponsored by the American Council of Engineering Companies (ACEC) and the National U.S.–Arab Chamber of Commerce. Ambassadors from Algeria, Egypt, Iraq, Libya and Morocco will take part in a networking dinner with U.S. engineering leaders on Monday, April 22.

That will be followed by an afternoon-long discussion with MENA business counsels and more than 25 top U.S. engineering leaders on Wednesday, April 24, as part of the ACEC Annual Convention, at the Grand Hyatt Hotel in Washington D.C.
